#### The CORE Rules

All students in NSW government school are expected to:

- attend every school day/unless legally excused, and be in class on time and prepared to learn
- maintain a neat appearance, including adhering to the requirements of the school's uniform policy
- behave safely, and responsibly, including when travelling to and from school
- show respect at all times to teachers, school staff and each other by following class rules, speaking courteously and co-operating with instructions and learning activities
- treat one another with dignity and respect
- care for property belonging to themselves, the school and others
- behave in a manner that does infringe on the safety of others, such as harassment, bullying and illegal or anti-social behaviour

#### The School Wellbeing Policy and STRIVE code aims to:

- create a safe, caring school environment wherein all students are supported as they learn
- enhance effective teaching and learning by encouraging students to take responsibility for their own learning.
- provide students with a range of opportunities to demonstrate success, respect and responsibility.
- allow students to develop skills in forming positive relationships, social responsibility, conflict resolution.
- provide students opportunities to develop confidence and self-esteem
- promote student participation in decision-making
- develop and implement policies and procedures that protect the rights, safety and health of all school community members
- value and celebrate gender and cultural differences
- establish strong and supportive community and interagency networks

#### Staff Responsibilities

- follow policies and procedures that protect the rights, safety and health of the whole school population in line with our STRIVE expectations.
- identify and cater for individual learning needs of all students.
- establish well managed and safe learning environments.
- provide programs, resources and support services for students with specific needs.
- utilise alternative learning programs established by Learning Support Team.
- be familiar with all Student Health / Medical Plans.
- be familiar with all Aboriginal Students' Personalised Learning Plans

#### **Teacher 1st Warning**

- Re enforce STRIVE values and expectations
- Ask student to follow school expectations and rules



#### Teacher 2nd Warning

- Re enforce STRIVE values and expectations
- Remind student to follow school expectations and rules
- Log incident on Sentral

#### Teacher 3rd Warning

- Place student on time out
- Student to complete Blue Reflection Sheet
- Log incident and consequences on Sentral

- Refer to HT to interview
- HT to place student on ORANGE LEVEL

#### **ORANGE LEVEL for FIVE lessons**

- Student to develop behaviour goals.

#### Improvement Demonstrated

- Student receives positive reinforcement
- Behaviour continues to be monitored or a PINK LEVEL

#### **STRIVE Improvement Program**

The Stage Deputy Principal in consultation with other staff members will determine how to implement the program.

The STRIVE Improvement Program MAY include:

- Withdrawal of student from classes (Faculty HT and Stage DP)
- Partial attendance
- STRIVE coaching sessions (SGS)
- STRIVE mentoring (Deputies, HT's, Teachers)

#### NO IMPROVEMENT DEMONSTRATED

- Student is placed on a RED Level
- DP / Senior Executive to determine appropriate action
  - > Formal caution
  - > In-school Suspension
  - Short Suspension
  - Long Suspension
