Parramatta CBD – October 2019

COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

9 October 2019 – PLR IW 06

The \$2.4 billion Parramatta Light Rail will connect Westmead to Carlingford via the Parramatta CBD and Camellia, transporting around 28,000 people every day to key destinations, new communities and essential services. It is expected to open in 2023.

Work to install a new conduit crossing on Macquarie Street, Parramatta is planned to commence from **Saturday 12 October 2019** and will take approximately **ten nights** to complete, weather permitting.

Parramatta Connect (CPB Dower Joint Venture), has been engaged by Transport for NSW to complete this work.

Upcoming Work: Macquarie Street, Parramatta

Work to install a new fibre optic conduit across Macquarie Street east of Barrack Lane, adjacent to Arthur Phillip High School will include:

- Excavating a trench across Macquarie Street, starting on the southern side of Macquarie Street and progressing in stages to the northern side.
- Installing new conduit in the roadway (trench).
- Temporarily reinstating the roadway at the end of each shift for safe access.

When will the work take place?

Most of this work will be undertaken at night, between the hours of **8pm and 6am, Sunday to Thursday**. Some activities will be carried out during the day on **Saturday, between 8am and 6pm**.

Works are mostly being undertaken at night because traffic and pedestrian volumes are such that delivering these works during the day is likely to pose an unacceptable risk to public safety and / or road network operations. This work is being coordinated with other contractors engaged by TfNSW to ensure impacts to residents, businesses and traffic are minimised.

Traffic and pedestrian access

Temporary pedestrian and traffic control will be in place as required to ensure traffic, pedestrians and the public can move around the work zones safely. Traffic management will include temporary road, footpath or lane closures and removal of kerbside parking.

Access to businesses will be maintained during operating hours, and access to driveways will be maintained at all times.

Please follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs and proceed carefully.

What equipment will be used?

Equipment will include, but is not limited to concrete saws, jackhammers, compactors, excavators, power tools, hand tools, trucks, light vehicles, lighting towers for night works and vacuum excavation trucks.

How will the work affect you?

There will be some noise and vibration associated with this work. This will be intermittent and a maximum of four nights of noise generating works will be delivered in any seven-day period. Highly noise intensive works will be completed by 10pm each night. We understand our work may be disruptive and we apologise for any inconvenience.

We will make every effort to minimise noise and vibration by:

- Where possible, completing work activities during standard construction hours.
- Providing respite periods for any high noise activities.
- Using measures such as noise blankets where possible, completing the noisiest activities first and non-tonal reversing beepers, to minimise the impact of noise.
- Monitoring and reviewing noise levels.
- Consulting with directly affected residents and businesses.
- Using water carts to wet down areas as required.
- Turning off equipment and vehicles when not in use.
